

CLOSING THE OPPORTUNITY GAP

Who We Are

Educare California at Silicon Valley is an innovative early learning school that closes the opportunity gap for low-income children ages 0-5 and their families and caregivers. With our partners, we offer high-quality early learning through 12 classrooms as well as family engagement classes, support services and community resources through our Family Resource Center. Our campus also houses a satellite children's museum, a satellite public library, and a Professional Development Institute. Our free services are offered in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese and work to nurture children's social-emotional and cognitive skills.

1,400 children and families served



59% of Educare parents report a home language other than English (37% Spanish, 22% Vietnamese). **64%** of

Educare families identified as Hispanic, and **32%** identified as Vietnamese.

Family Impact

Children learn when they are full, happy, and healthy. As part of our family engagement services, we launched a **free food distribution program**. In partnership with Second Harvest Silicon Valley and Franklin-McKinley Children's Initiative, 125 families receive full family-style meals every other Friday through the A La Carte truck.

We offer free evidence-based workshops—including *Abriendo Puertas*, Triple P, and 24/7 Dad—to help parents and caregivers support their child's learning and development. Attending workshops also expands caregivers' connections to other families and free community resources.



Classroom Programs

We offer free, high-quality early education and supportive resources to ensure children are prepared for success in school and in life.



12 full-day, year-round classrooms

To better support the language needs of the diverse community we serve, we initiated a **Dual Language Learner (DLL) pilot program** and will be scaling it throughout the campus in FY19-20. By encouraging all our students to learn English, Spanish and Vietnamese inside the classroom, we're fostering multilingualism and building a strong foundation for their futures.

THE NEED IS GREAT...



26% of Educare parents do not have a high school diploma/GED.



97% of students in the Santee area qualify for free or reduced-price lunch.



69% of Educare households have an income at or less than \$30,000. This is **one-quarter** of the median household income in Silicon Valley.

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By age 3, children in poverty hear **30 million** fewer words than peers from high-income families. This word gap can mean that students start behind in school, and stay behind.
