Along with over 400 partners, funders, elected officials, and community members, Educare celebrates its opening with an official ribbon cutting event on October 16, 2015.



Educare receives a site score of 5, the highest possible rating on the Quality Rating and Improvement System, which assesses the quality of early learning initiatives. This signifies Educare's excellence in teaching, environment, and child development.

## BLENDED FUNDING MODEL PROVIDES SUSTAINABILITY

Educare directly raises and manages \$2.5 million in administrative and operating funds, while our public and private partners directly fund or provide in-kind donations for the remaining \$4.5 million needed to operate our school. This blended model allows us to have the impact of a \$7 million organization without the administrative burden.

Educare advocates for policies that will improve early childhood education at the local, state, and national levels. A few of our noteworthy policy efforts this year:

- Signed a joint federal <u>Every</u>
   <u>Student Success Act (ESSA)</u>
   letter recommending effective ways to promote early education.

- Supported <u>AB 2368</u> to improve high quality early learning, childcare and development services in Santa Clara County.
